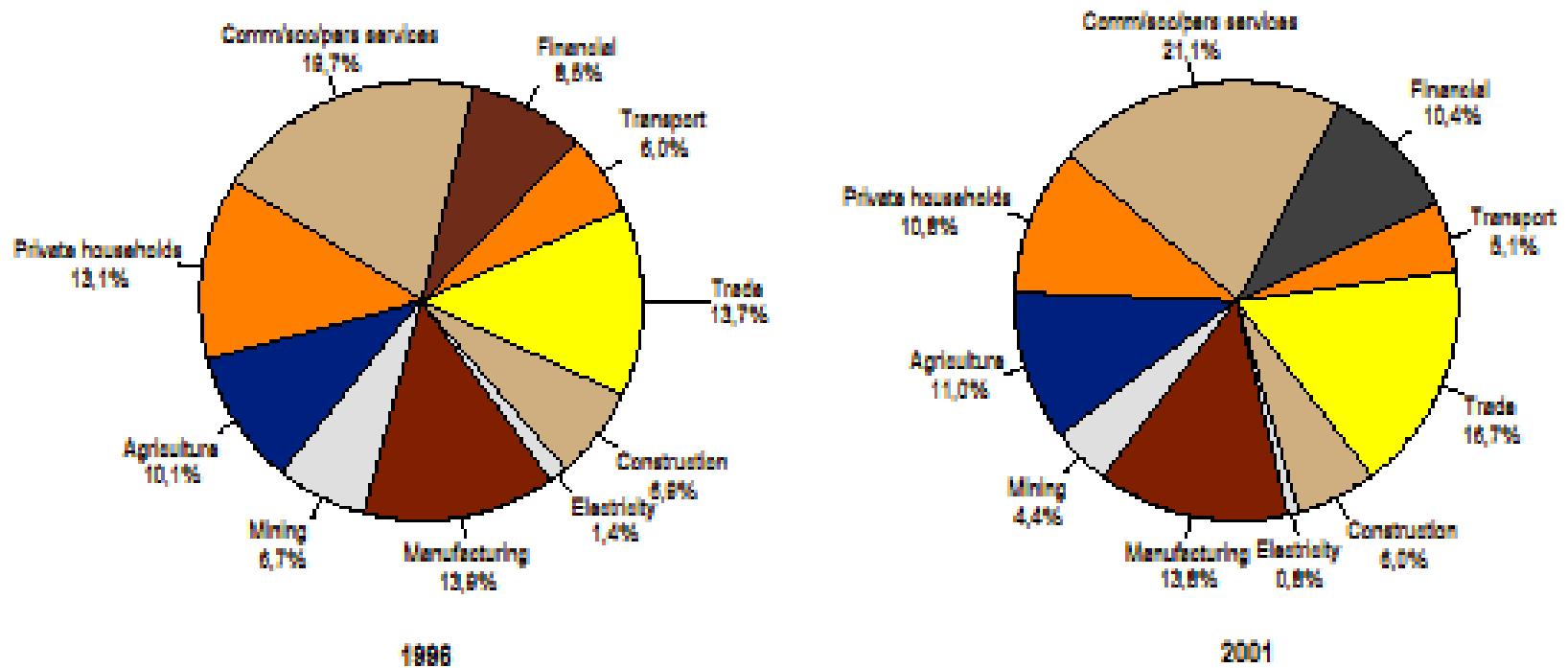

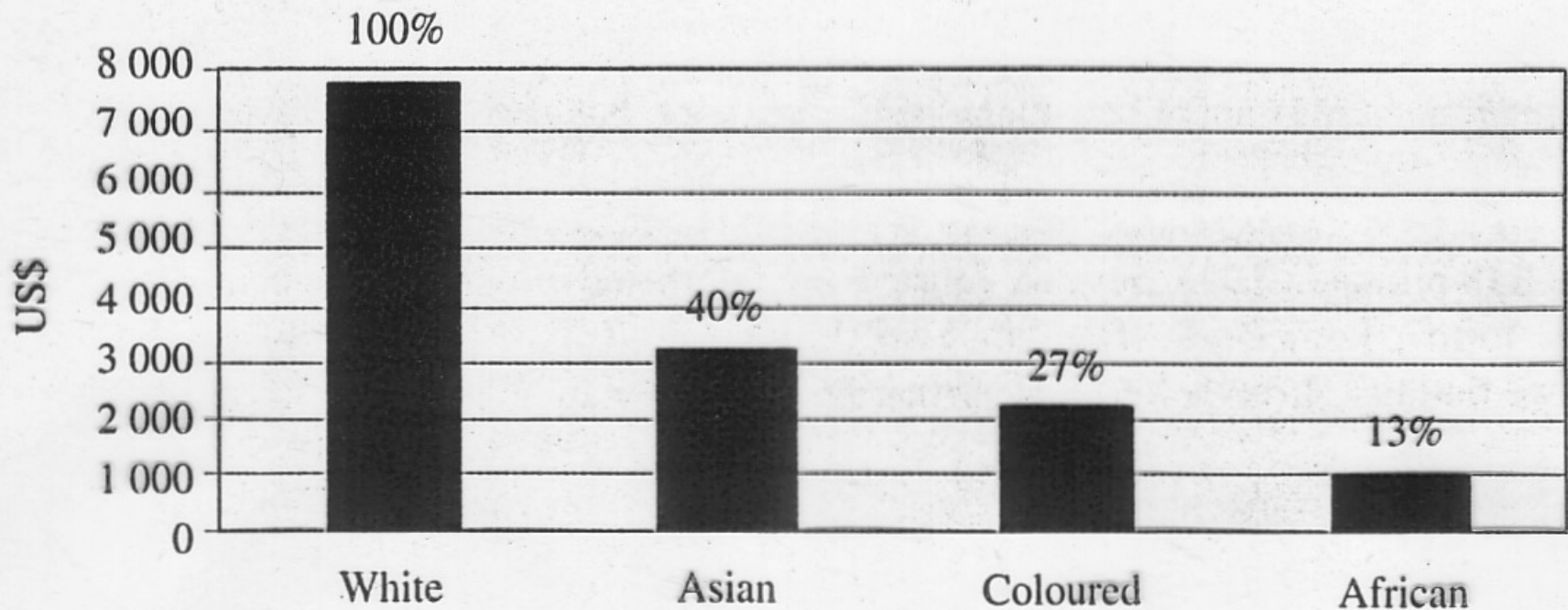

Census 1996 and 2001



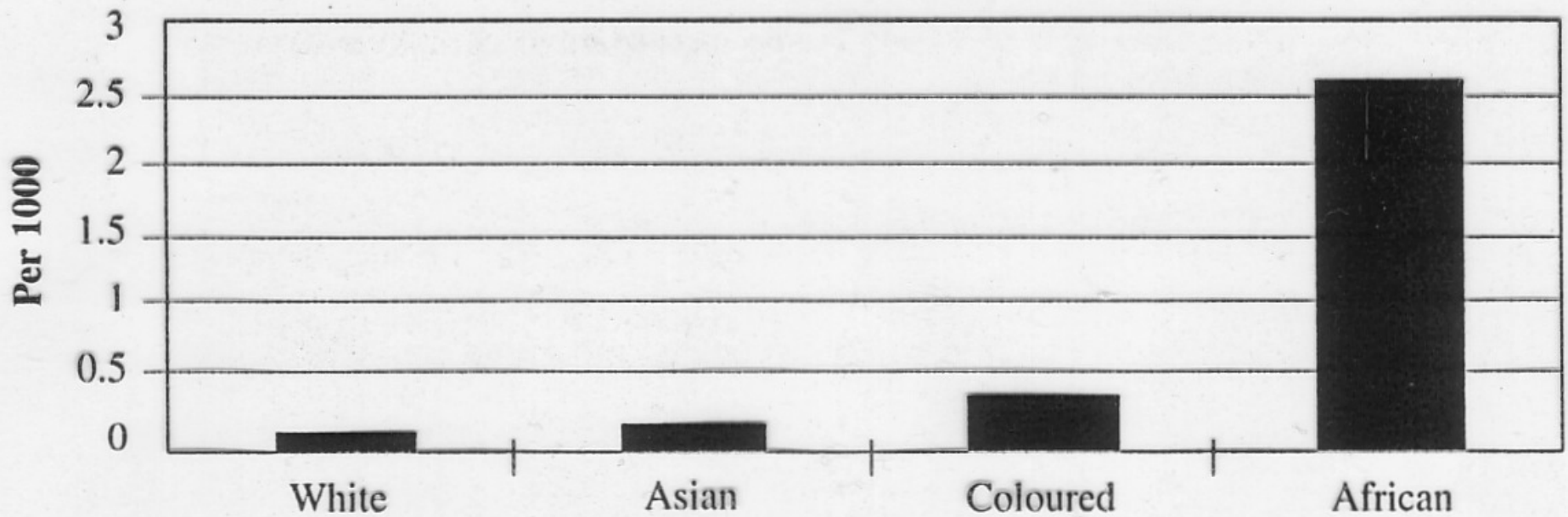

Per Capita Disposable Income

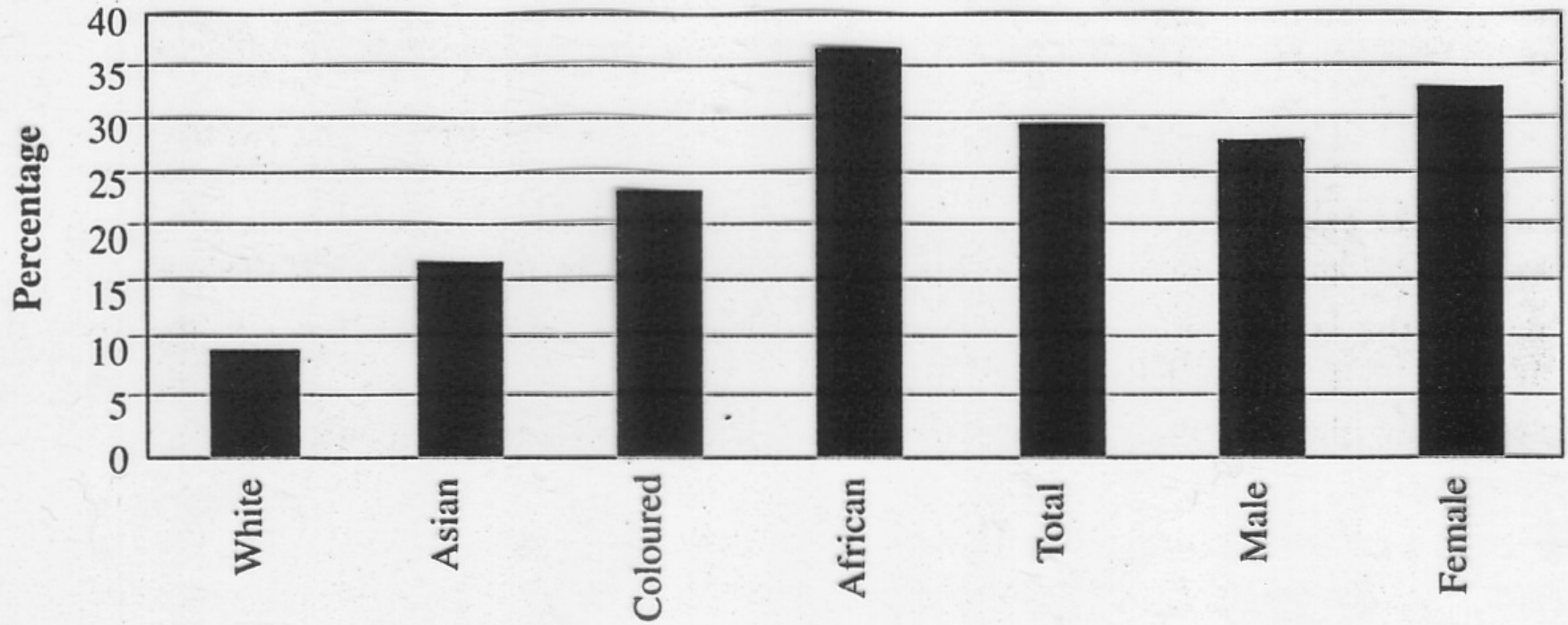

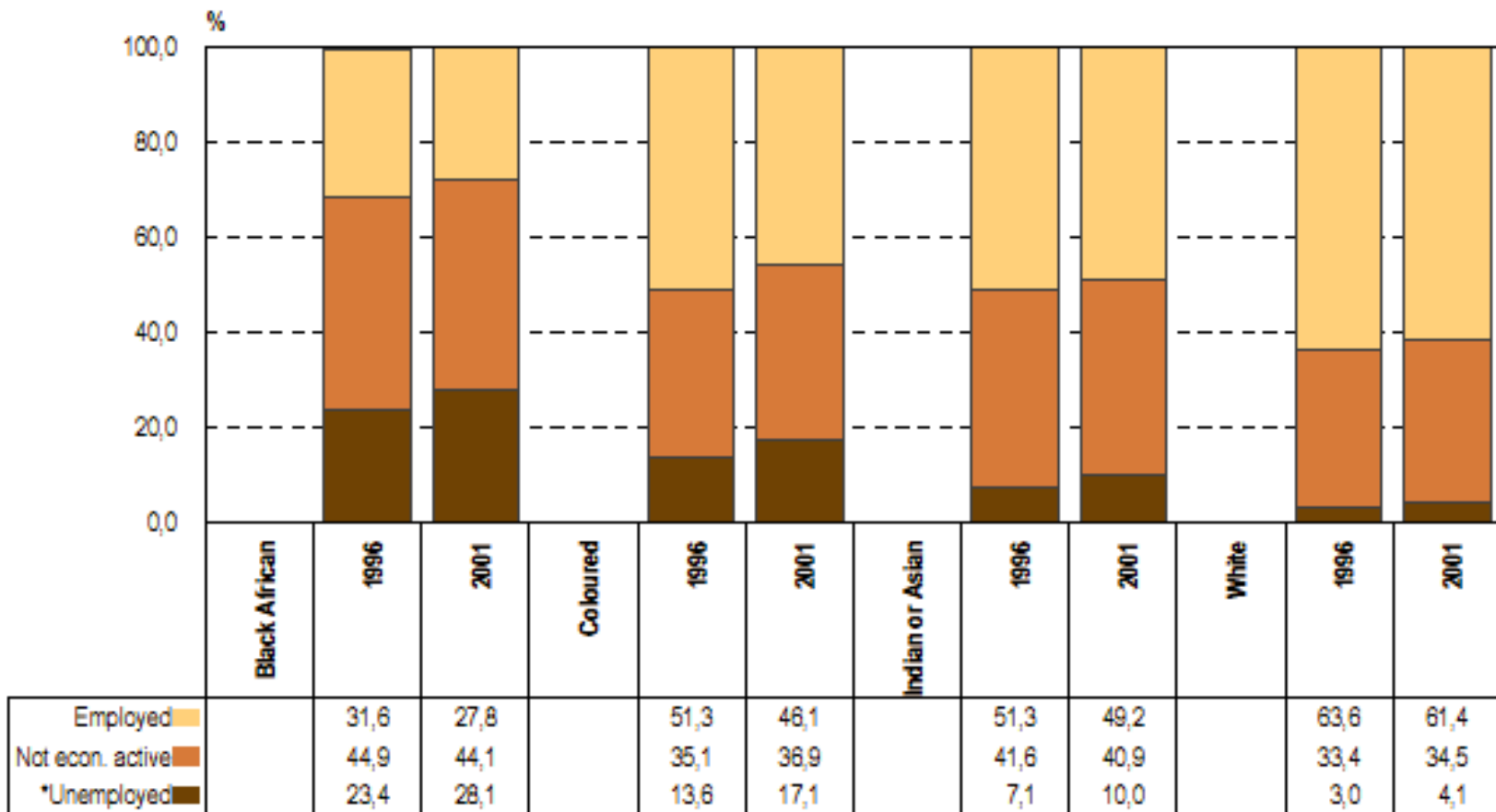

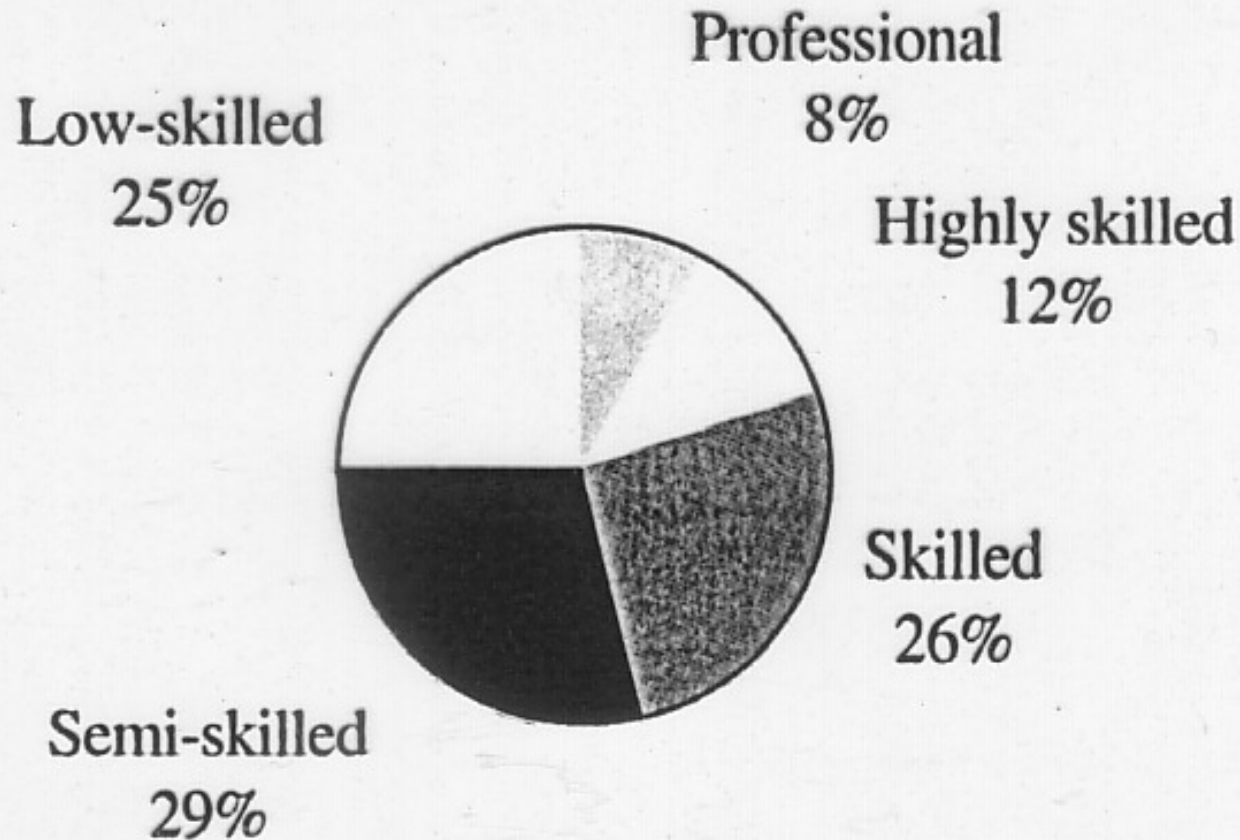
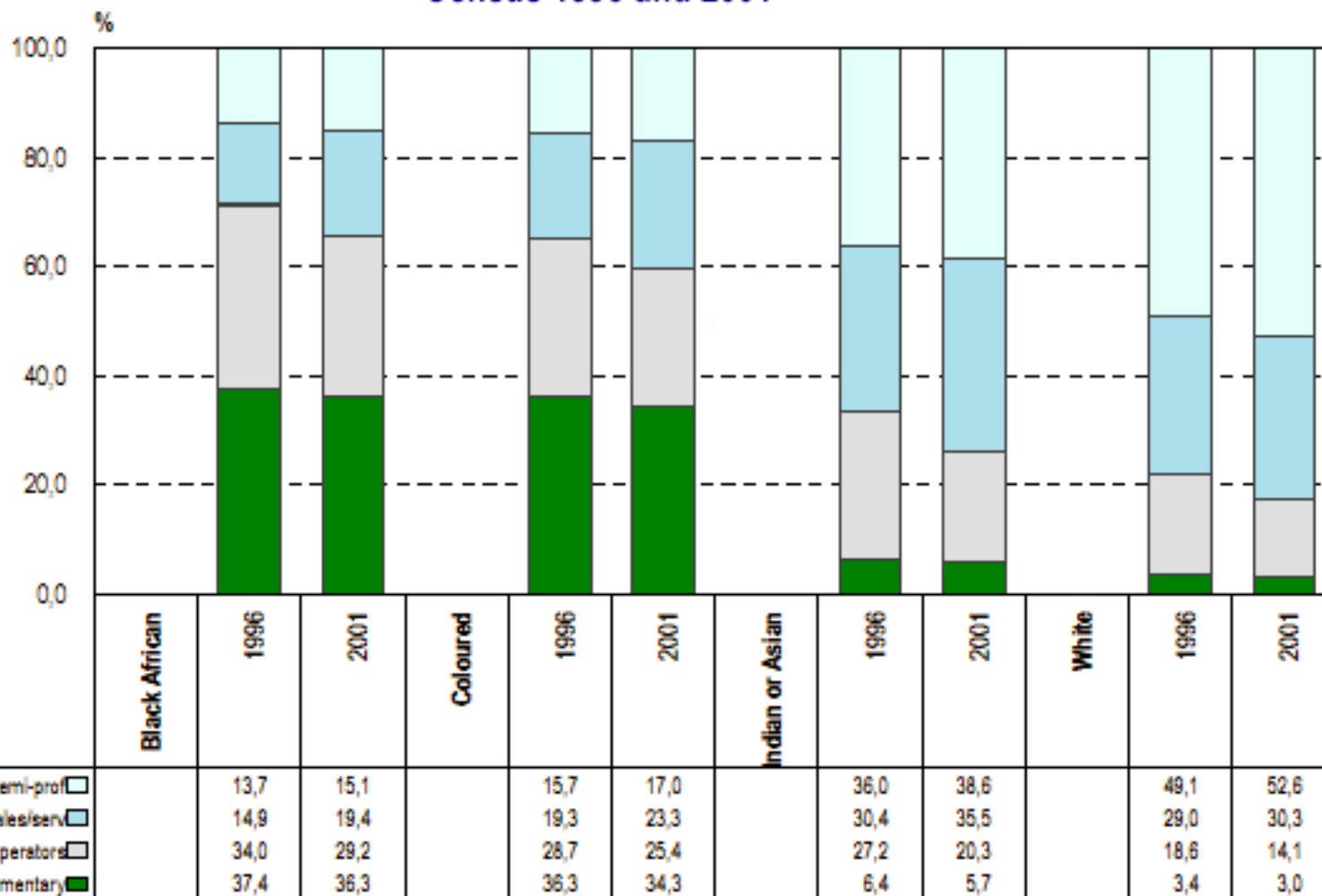


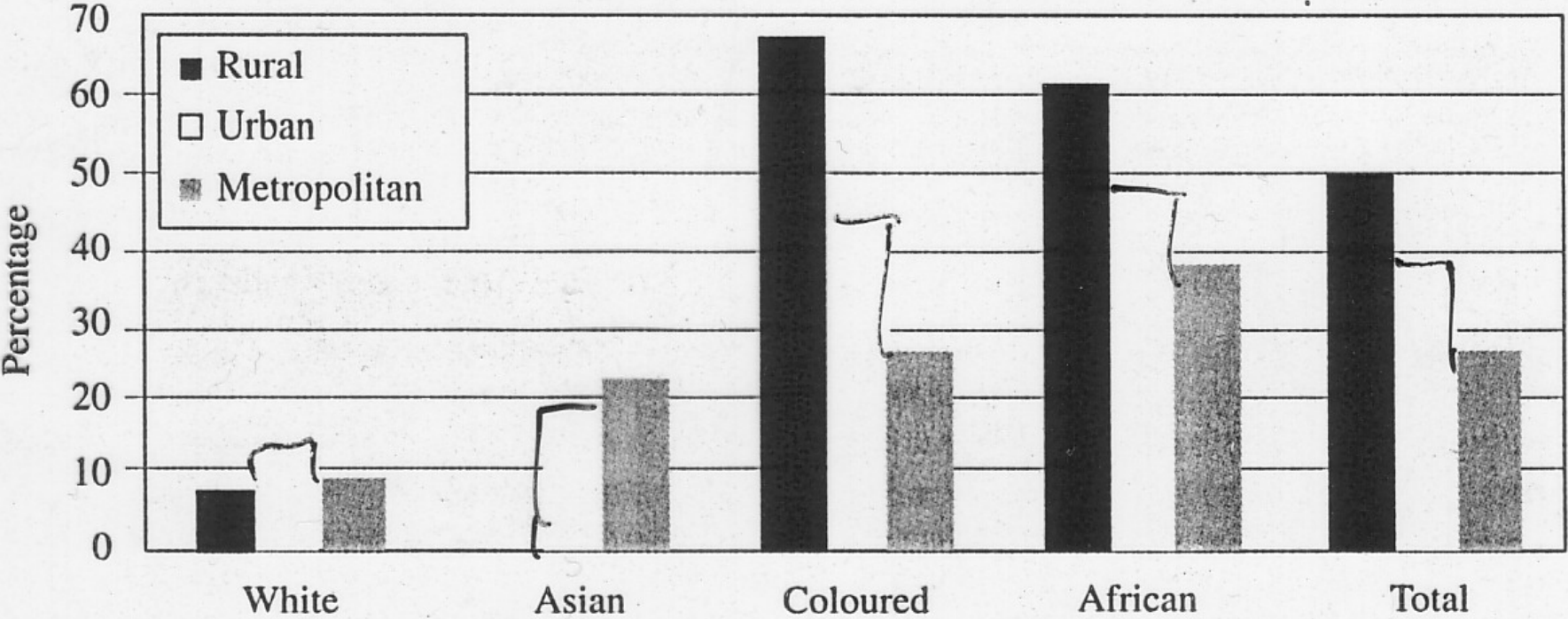

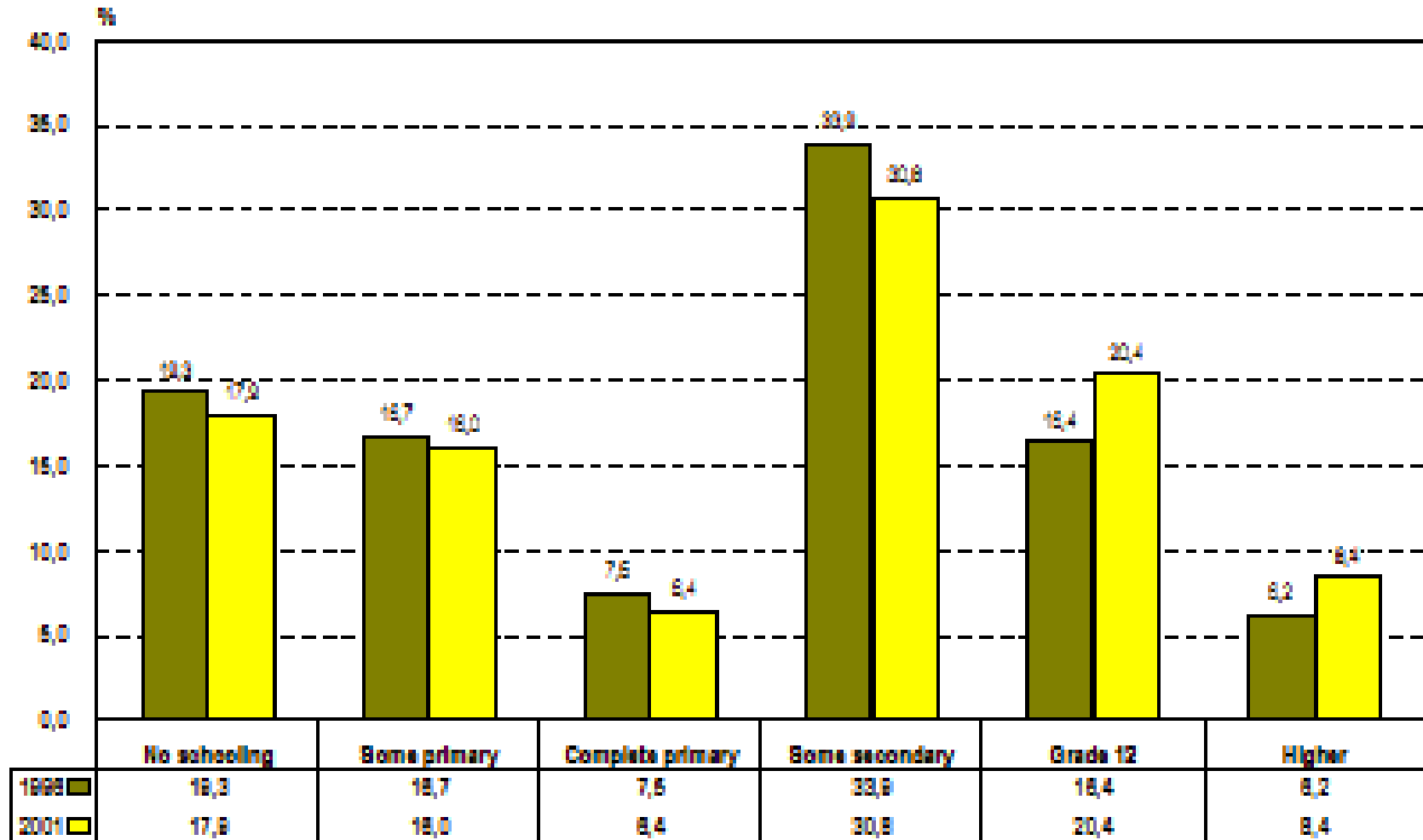

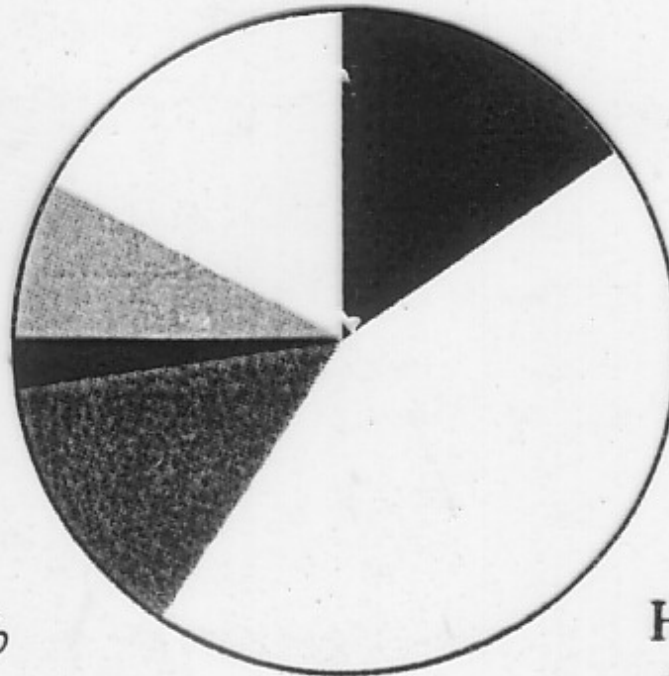
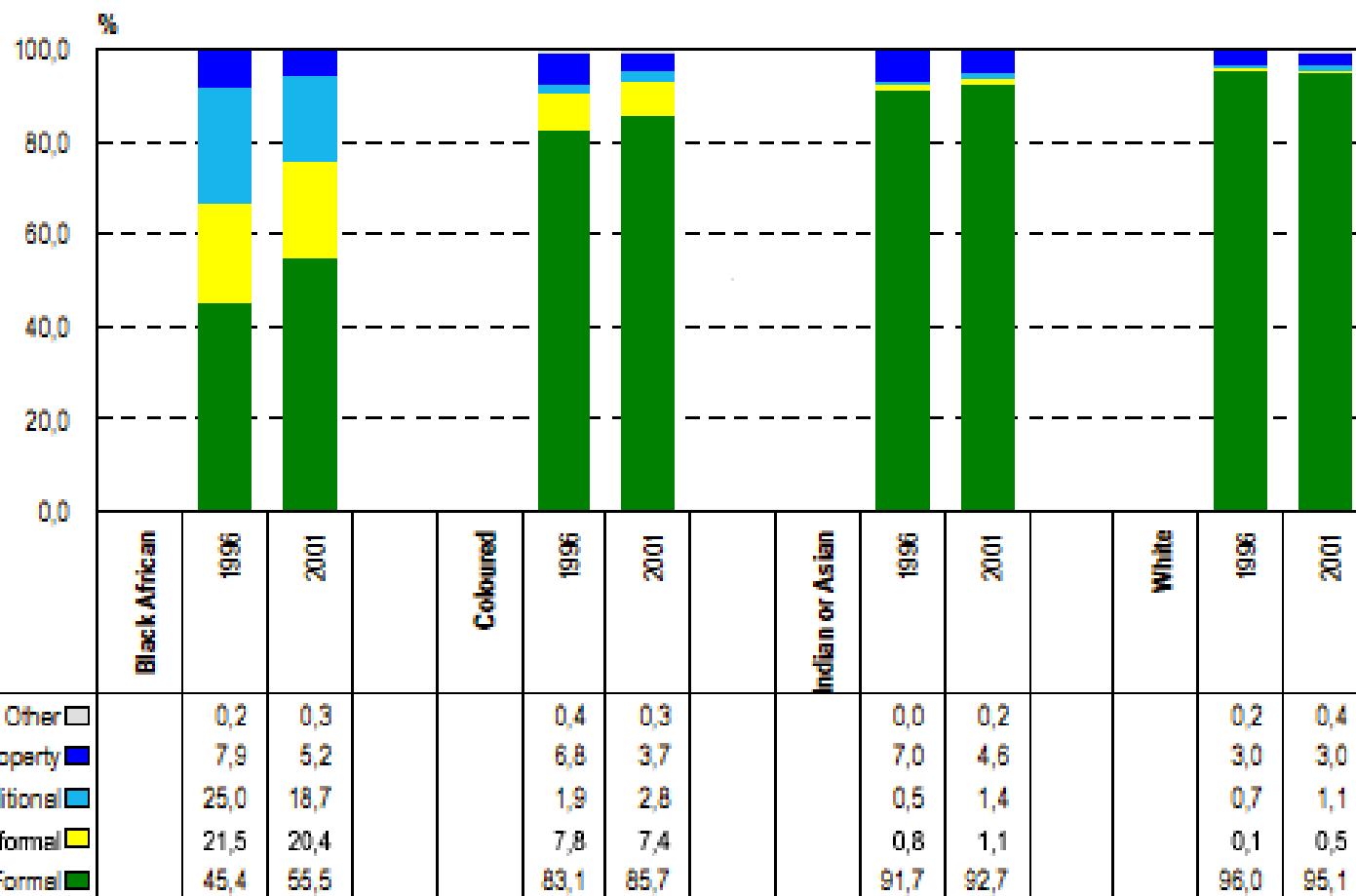

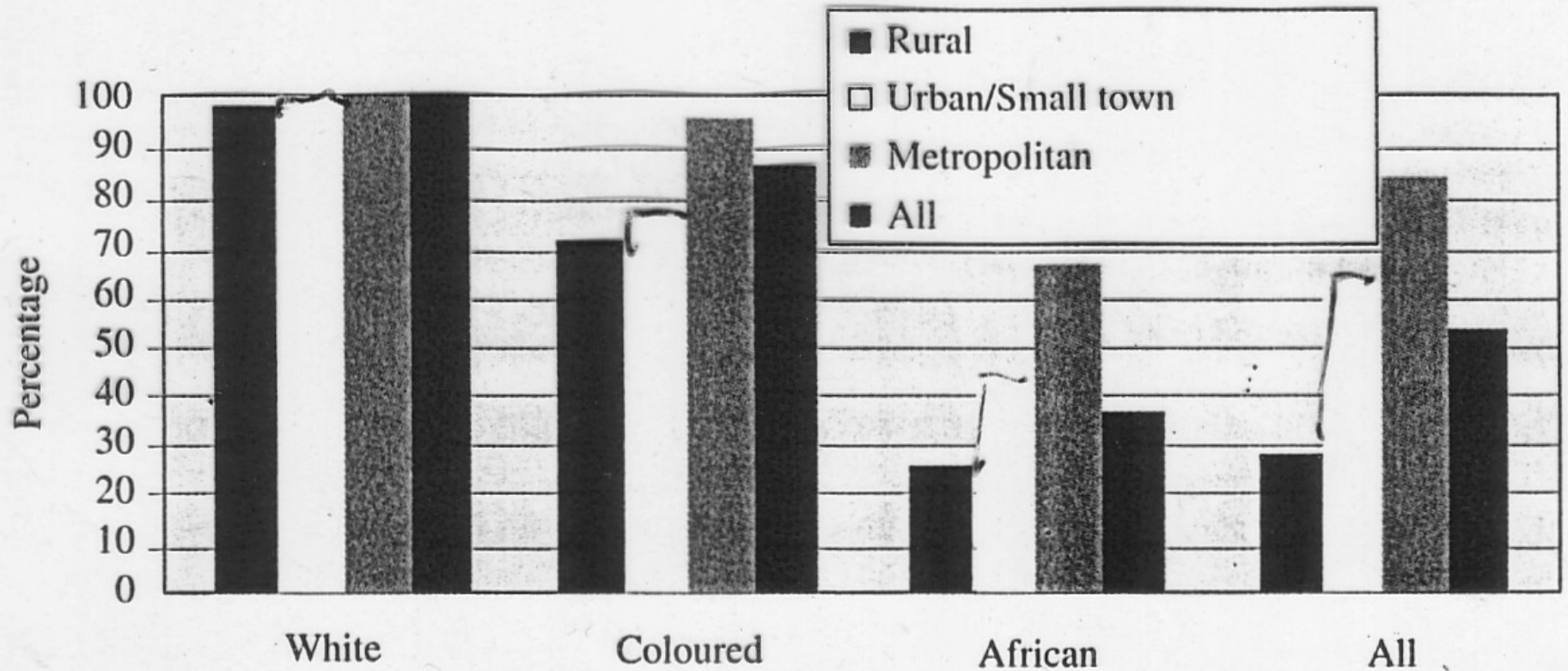
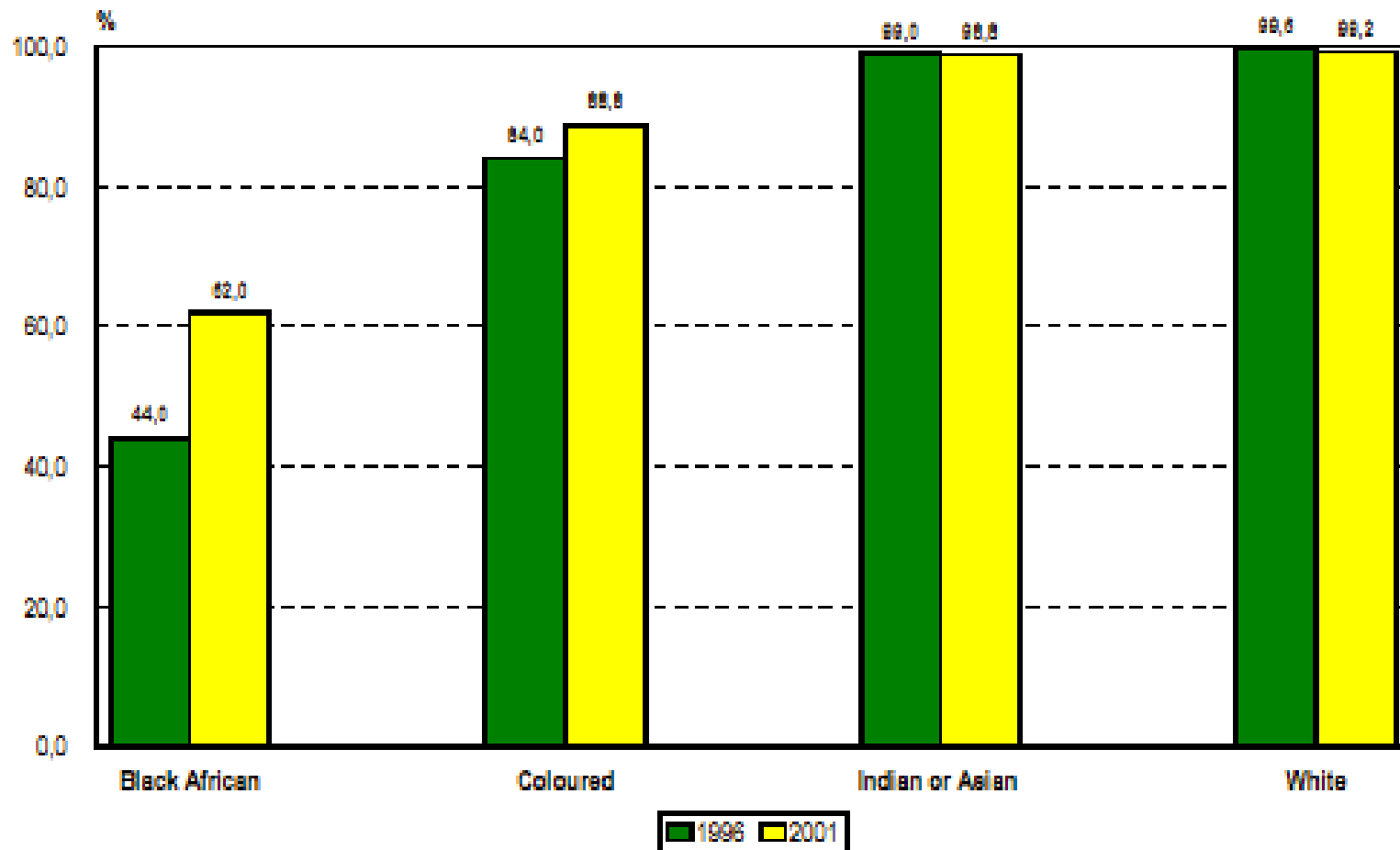

Census 1996 and 2001

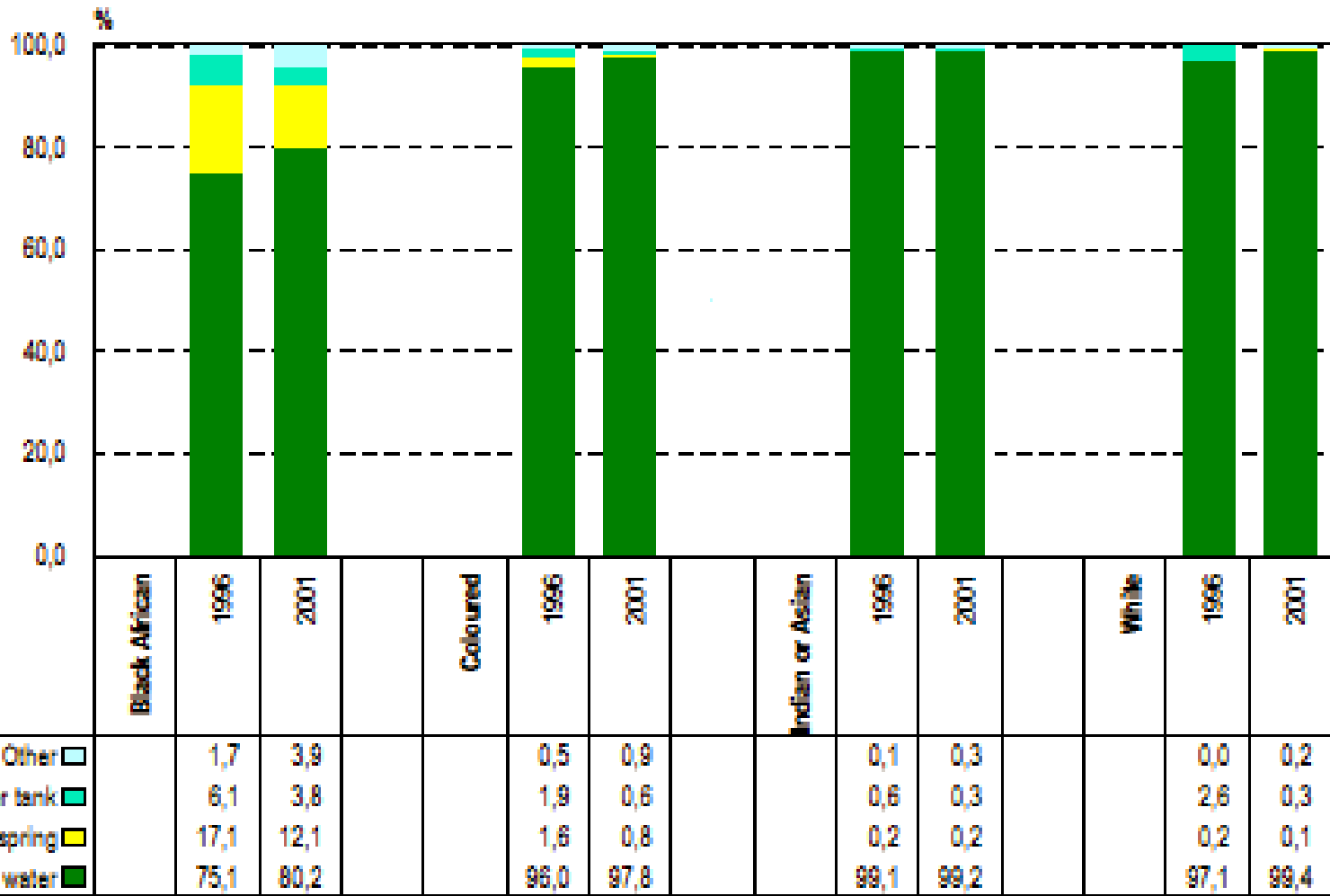
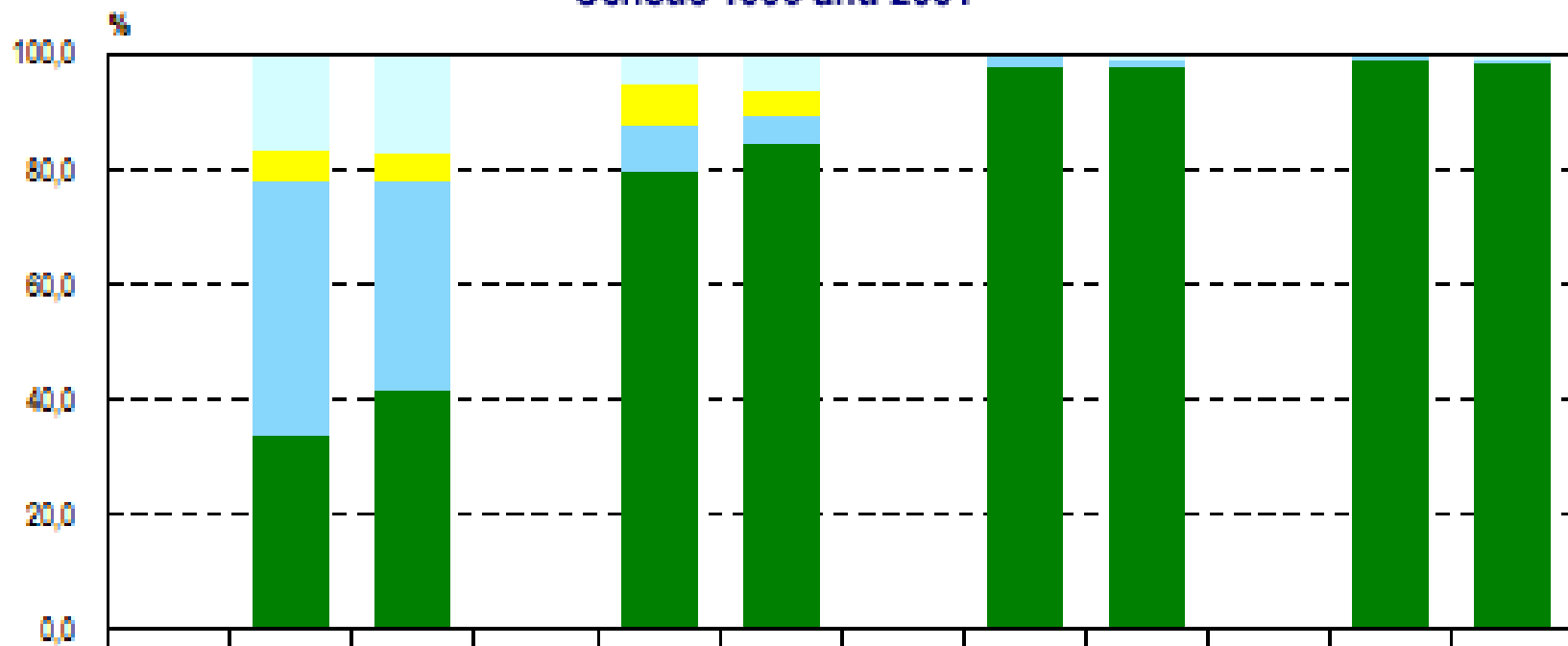
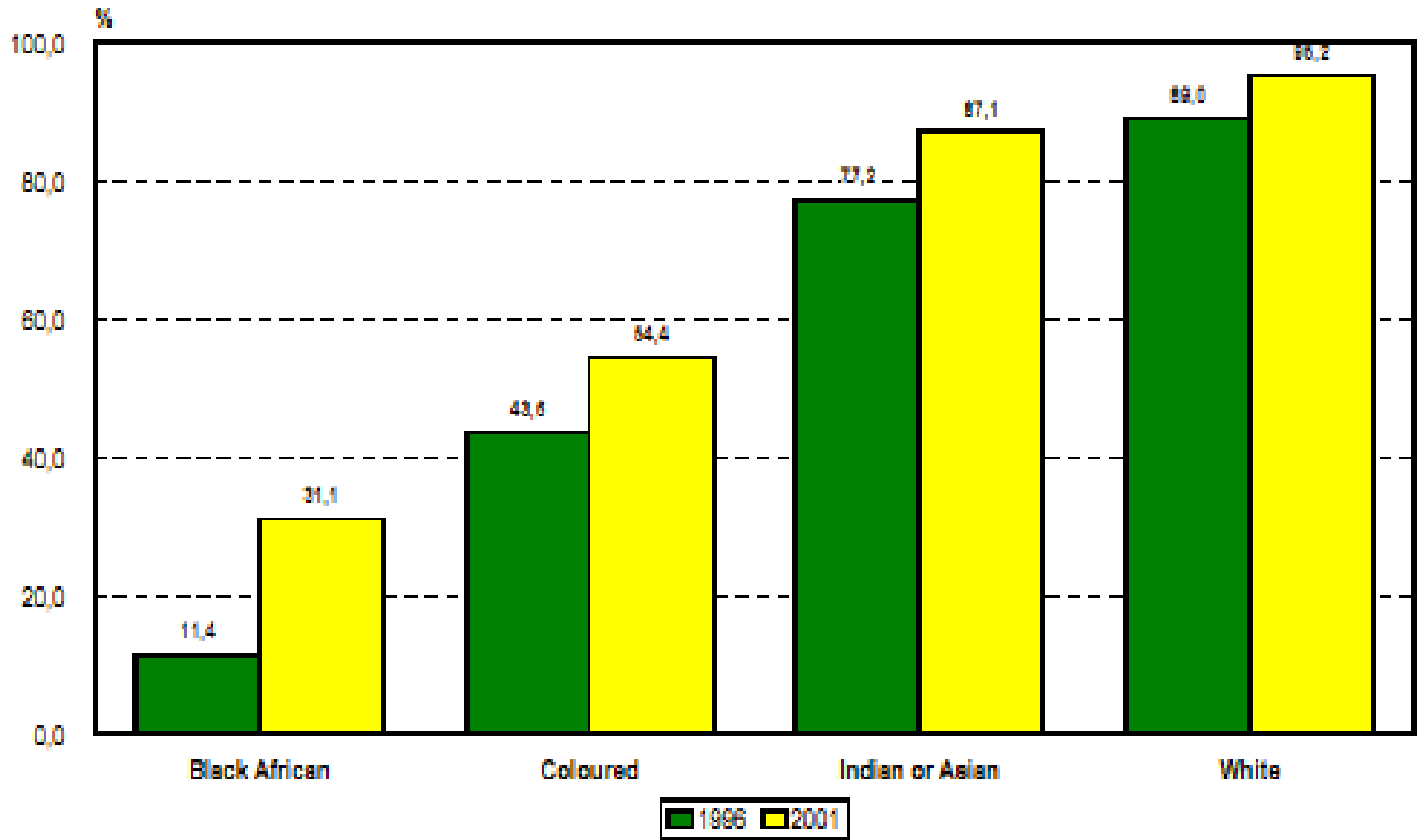

Census 1996 and 2001

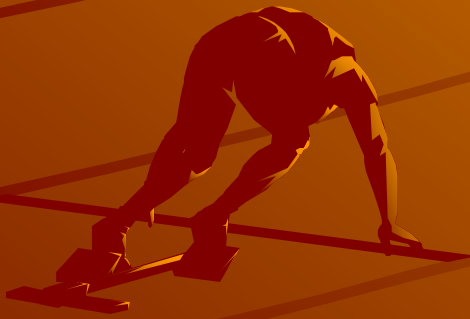
